This approach to learning enables inquisitive thinking such as exploration, investigation and problem solving. We want them to be lifelong learners.

Resilience, personal growth and well- being. Resilience means having the skills and resources to deal with challenges and set-backs. Our children will develop the emotional and physical security needed to become resilient individuals both in school and in the wider world. We have adopted the Growth Mindset approach to learning. We want to promote well-being and personal growth to ensure children reach their full potential and develop their learning, social and emotional skills.

Language and Communication

Communication skills are vital for both success and confidence in many areas of life and therefore we want our children to develop the ability to express themselves clearly and effectively. We recognise that both listening and speaking are important when communicating and opportunities to practice and develop these skills are provided. We know that having a broad vocabulary aids both understanding of language and expression.
