## Year 1 - English

As part of their homework, Year 1 have been talking to their family members about toys which have been 'passed down' through their family. The children were able to discuss their bears and we had a great discussion about how old some of the bears are and how they were made.













## Sport at Ellwood

Over the last few weeks, I have been monitoring PE throughout the school. The children have been reflecting on sporting events they have enjoyed and skills they have learnt this year. We believe in developing every child holistically and these opportunities build important life skills: resilience, team work, well being and physical development. The children have been very lucky to have opportunities to develop these skills this year and staff have worked hard to plan and organise them. We have been fortunate that we have been able to provide a variety of sports delivered by professional coaches: yoga, dance, biking, gymnastics, archery, cricket, kurling, mountain biking and swimming. This is on top of our standard PE curriculum.

The vast majority of year 6 children are able to swim, which is our aim by the time they leave Primary School. We have also been placed in local inter schools' competitions. The children have also had the opportunity to try new sports which they may not have had chance to try in the local community. The children have also suggested sports they would like to try and we will look at these in preparation for next year to see if they can be planned in to our curriculum, if at all possible.

It has been particularly wonderful to see how much the children have enjoyed their biking lessons over the last couple of terms. The biking team 'Follow my Lead' have been really impressed with how the children have developed their biking skills. In particular, Oak class where the vast majority of children are now able to pedal a bike independently without stabilisers! This is a fantastic achievement for such young children.
