## Personal, Social and Health Education [PSHE] at Ellwood Community Primary School At Ellwood Primary School our aim is to be regarded as an integral part of the Intent wider community. We aim to equip children with essential skills for life. We intend to develop the whole child through carefully planned and resourced lessons which develop the knowledge, skills and attributes that children need to protect and enhance their wellbeing. Children will learn how to stay safe and healthy, build and maintain successful relationships and become active citizens, responsibly participating in society now and in the future. The programme of study is a spiral curriculum to develop knowledge, skills and attributes, where prior learning is revisited, reinforced and extended year on year. All children will take part in well planned PSHE lessons which allow **Implementation** children to develop the knowledge and skills set out within the PSHE progression map. • All classes will have one PSHE lesson planned per week alongside additional opportunities to develop their personal, social and health knowledge and skills. • Pupils will develop their knowledge and skills around three core themes (Health and Wellbeing, Relationships and Living in the Wider World). These core themes are planned to ensure they meet each child's unique needs regardless of background, needs and abilities. Children will be taught 'Relationships and Sex Education' [RSE] in discrete year groups to ensure lessons are appropriately matched to the children's needs. • Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural [SMSC] development will be carefully incorporated into PSHE lessons as appropriate. Knowledge and understanding linked to the 'British Values' will be integrated into the teaching of PSHE as appropriate. ✓ Teachers will use the PSHE progression map to ensure children are taught **Impact** the appropriate knowledge and skills linked to the three core themes. ✓ Children will be aware of 'British Values' and how they shape our diverse society. ✓ Children will demonstrate the confidence needed to clearly articulate their thoughts and feelings. ✓ Children will build trusting and respectful relationships with their peers ✓ Children will apply their understanding of society to their everyday interactions, from the classroom to the wider community which they are part of. ✓ Our school culture will prioritise physical and mental health and wellbeing. ✓ Opportunities for learning outside of the classroom and within the wider community will be evidenced. ✓ Children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development will be evidenced in planning and in the opportunities provided. ✓ PSHE lessons will support vulnerable children to achieve by raising their aspirations and empowering them to overcome barriers they face.
