Full Opening of School from Monday 8th March 2021

Dear Parents,

I hope you all had a restful half-term. On Monday, the Government announced the roadmap to ease us out of lockdown. We are really hopeful that this is the end of the lockdowns and we will all be able to cautiously regain some sense of normality and life as we knew it before March last year.

To confirm, school will be open from 8th March to ALL children. It is our current intention that we will revert back to the plan with staggered drop-off and pick-up times, just as we had in place when we started the new term in September 2020. However, there could be a few minor adjustments needed if any further guidance is given from the DFE and Government, but as it stands most of the guidance remains similar to the Autumn term.

We appreciate that this may still be a worrying time for some of our pupils and families but we will continue to implement our robust risk assessment and additional protective measures to ensure that the pupils and staff remain as safe as possible. The majority of the school staff now complete twice weekly tests using the lateral flow rapid tests supplied by the Government and this helps to give some reassurance to staff and hopefully helps to protect the school community.

We are confident that everyone in our school community will continue to support all our efforts and continue to follow the rules and guidance until they are gradually lifted. This is so important as hopefully we will continue to reduce any risk of transmission and help to ensure that our children can attend school and maintain an uninterrupted face-to-face education they so rightly deserve.

We know that some children and bubbles may still have to isolate but we have a contingency plan in place for this and school work will be emailed or loaded onto the platform for these children, as and when needed. Our full remote learning offer is on the school website.

Staff, Governors and I would like to thank you all for your continued support, understanding, perseverance and kind words over the last half-term. It means a lot to all of us and has kept us going when things were tough.

Please see the drop-off and pick-up information on the next page. The risk assessment and more detailed opening information has been emailed to you.

We look forward to seeing the children back on the 8th March. Until then, take care and stay safe.

World Book Day Activities







SCHOOLS TREE PLANTING PROJECT

HELLO AGAIN EVERYONE,

We do hope that you have all been looking forward to being back at School. It has not been a lot of fun with all the frost and rain that we have suffered, and gardens are still recovering, but the daffodils are growing well now and are coming in bloom and the birds have started to build their nests. Like you, we have planted acorns and are hoping that they will now soon start to sprout. We have bought large pots ready for when the acorns are growing well so that they can be planted on still in the pots that were planted as these will break down in the compost in time. The plants will need to stay in those pots until 2022 when we will be able to plant them out in the place where they will then be left to grow. We are waiting now for beech seeds to arrive ready for planting in more small pots and they will later also be transplanted on in the same way as the acorn seedlings.
