As part of our whole school, well-being approach we are using Trick Box, which is a fun and effective personal development programme, to help children from Reception to Year 6 to;

- Build confidence
- Manage emotions and anxiety
- Develop communication skills
- Make positive choices about actions
- Coach themselves through challenges



From Reception to Year 6 your child will be introduced to 24 'tricks' and a simple selfcoaching model called Letter Box, designed to give them positive habits for life.

We'll be practising the tricks at school and it would be great if you could also practise these tricks at home with your child.
