COVID Update

Friday 18th December

As you may have heard in the media, the Department for Education (DFE) released information this week, which would enable schools to take Friday the 18th December as an Inset day. We want to reassure parents that we will be not be doing this, as it is very short notice for schools, not very beneficial and not helpful for working parents. Therefore, school will be open to all, as normal, on Friday 18th and finish at 2.05pm (Chestnut and Beech) and 2.15 (Oak, Sycamore and Willow), as we had previously planned.

Our INSET will go ahead as planned on Monday 4th January 2021 and children should **return to school as planned on Tuesday 5th January**. Our current staggered drop off and pick up times will stay the same when we return in the new year.

Track and Trace

You may have also been made aware of the controversy about the additional pressures added to schools to be part of the track and trace system, particularly over the holiday period.

We wanted to make our school families aware of the following arrangements regarding positive cases in the holidays:

CONTACT US IF THE FOLLOWING OCCURS:

For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. The school SHOULD be contacted.

Please email admin@ellwood.gloucs.sch.uk for reporting positive cases during the holiday period (only for the first 6 days); this email will be checked daily, until Christmas Eve which is 6 days after the final day of contact within school.

If we are informed that a **pupil or staff member has tested positive** for coronavirus **within the first 6 days** after teaching ends, we will **send an email, text notification** and also put a notice on the **school website** (home page) **and facebook,** to inform the **relevant bubbles** of their **need to self-isolate**. It is then down to individual families to ensure they follow these rules.

DO NOT CONTACT US IF THE FOLLOWING OCCURS:

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms <u>more than 48 hours</u> since being in school, the school should NOT be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Where **pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days** following the end of term, **schools DO NOT need to be informed** about their absence until the first day of the new term.

We are hoping for all our school and staff families that we can make it safely to the end of term and avoid any of our families having to self-isolate over the festive period.

We urge everyone to continue their efforts in staying as Covid secure as possible.

HANDS FACE SPACE

- Please wear a mask at all times when around the school grounds
- Please continue to maintain social distancing
- Avoid car sharing with other people/children from different bubbles
- Please ensure your children are not in close contact with children from other bubbles outside of school
- Remain vigilant with regards to mixing with other bubbles over the festive period to help keep yourselves, your families, friends, staff and the community safe. We are conscious that there could be a spike in positive cases after Christmas due to people mixing and we really want to keep this as low as possible.
