COVID Update


We still have a few positive cases in school but not yet classed as an outbreak as the numbers are relatively low; the children are spread across the school and not all in one particular class. For the time being we will continue with the procedures we currently have in place and keep you updated of any changes. Thank you for your support with this.

Please remember to have a PCR test for your child if they are showing any symptoms and keep us informed of the outcome. We have now had CO2 monitors delivered into school and these have been installed in each classroom. Please be aware these are not going to prevent COVID but are a gentle reminder to staff to increase the ventilation in the rooms as much as physically possible if the monitor indicates they need to. We are keen to put as many measures in place as possible and welcome any help to try and prevent the spread of the virus.





Was your child born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018?



Any child born between the above dates can start school in the school year starting from **1 September 2022**. Gloucestershire County Council co-ordinates the admission of children to primary or infant school therefore you must apply to us to receive a school place for your child by the closing date **15 January 2022**

If you have not heard from us by 1st December you must contact us so we can send you the information you will need to apply for a school place. If you do not apply on time you may not get a place at the school you want.

Key dates

November 2021 – You should receive a letter from us advising you how to apply for a school place

15 January 2022 – Deadline for making your application

19 April 2022 – Allocation Day (find out which school we can offer your child)
