Well done to everyone that took part in the Christmas Reading Challenge. It was great to see so many children enjoying their reading over the Christmas break.





Willow Class-Project with 'One Voice Choir'

Following our partnership this year with the Big Ideas Co. and working with them on their Motherhood, Loss and the First World War project, there have been some brilliant results. We wanted to share one such activity which was particularly touching.

Nikki from Innsworth Military Wives Choir introduced the project to the children she teaches as it fitted well with their work on WW1. The children shared their responses to the letters and local Forest of Dean publications, by writing their own, from the perspective of both mothers and sons during WW1.
