## Welcome Back!

We hope you all had a lovely summer break. We would like to welcome Miss Briggs, Miss Hayward and Mrs Hunt to the Ellwood School team. We are looking forward to another great term and we have lots of exciting learning opportunities planned for children. The staff have been busy over the summer preparing lessons and their classrooms. We are excited to welcome the children back into school tomorrow (Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September).

### Back to School Reminders

- All children (apart from our new Reception starters) are being welcomed back into school tomorrow (Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September).
- The gate will open at 8:45am and close at promptly 8:55am. If your child arrives after 8:55am they will need to go to the office to register. You will also need to sign them in and provide a reason for lateness. We need to ensure children are not wasting valuable learning time in the mornings as this can greatly impact educational attainment.
- Please return all reading books that were loaned to the children for summer holidays on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September.
- Please ensure your child has a labelled water bottle (no fizzy drinks/juice) in school every day.
- Children in reception, year 1 and 2 are provided with a free piece of fruit/raw vegetable every day. Children in year 3, 4, 5 and 6 will need to bring a piece of fruit or raw vegetable for snack time. No items in plastic wrappers to reduce litter on our playground.

### Phase Leaders

This year we have two phase leaders. Miss Peart will lead EYFS and KS1 (year 1 and year 2). Mrs Woodhouse will lead KS2 (year 3, 4, 5 and 6). They form part of the senior leadership team alongside Mrs Milford.

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They will be able to support parents, carers and children within their key stage. You are welcome to make contact with them if you have any queries.


### **ClassDojo**

This year, we are going to introduce ClassDojo for parents/carers to provide a home-school link.

Each parent/carer (with parental responsibility) is encouraged to sign up to ClassDojo to access their child's account.

### Biking

## Reading

At Ellwood Community Primary School, we are passionate about reading and aim to ensure that all children leave school as confident and capable readers.

Our expectation is that all children read **at least four times weekly** at home. Children who do not read at least four times a week at home will attend reading club in school once a week, at playtime, to give them another opportunity to develop their reading skills.

The research linked to reading for pleasure is clear...

- There is a growing body of evidence which illustrates the importance of reading for pleasure for both educational purposes as well as personal development (cited in Clark and Rumbold, 2006).
- Evidence suggests that there is a positive relationship between reading frequency, reading enjoyment and attainment (Clark 2011; Clark and Douglas 2011).
