TTRS can be downloaded as an app on multiple devices so that you child can easily access it.

Times tables matter and multiplication facts are non-negotiable basic building blocks that the children need in order to be successful in all areas of Maths.

Knowing the times tables (and their associated division facts) supports mathematical learning and understanding and those children who have a strong grasp of them tend to be more self-assured when learning new concepts. Every pupil should start secondary school with a fluent, accessible and automatic knowledge of their times tables.



### **Uniform reminders -**

A reminder that children should be wearing black or navy blue sensible sport/running trainers for P.E. Fashion trainers and trainers that are not appropriate for P.E cannot be worn.

Leggings should also not be worn in place of school trousers.

Earrings - only small studs that need to either be taken out or taped up before P.E sessions. Not doing this could result in your child missing out. Please can children also not wear jewelry to school such as bracelets etc.

Long hair should be tied up and no extreme hair colours to be worn during term time.

We need to be fair and consistent with all children across the school.

Please can children also wear sensible clothing on Forest Adventure days, we are noticing more and more than fashion items are starting to be worn for this too.

### **Tesco Stronger Starts Community Grant**

Mrs Milford recently put in a grant for funding from Tesco Community grants. Part of the application process was having the blue tokens in local Tesco stores. We are pleased to announce that we have been successful in going through to the last phase of the process in receiving a grant of £500 which will go towards creating a small 'hub' outside space for children to use at playtime and lunchtimes.

The intention is for it to be used for children to relax in, have a quiet space, carry out reading activities, talk to friends and can also be used for as a quiet space for family support workers to work with children to enhance their well being.

We hope to be able to update you more in the next few months.

## What's Up Gov?

The non-staff Governors at Ellwood School are all unpaid volunteers, usually co-opted or voted onto the Board by the parents/carers, for tenures of 4 years, which can be renewed.

Governor of all schools in England have 3 key, non-operational duties, as follows:  
Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.

Holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the School and its pupils' outcomes and the effective and efficient performance of staff management.

Overseeing the financial performance of the School and ensuring its money is well spent.

Ellwood's governors (whose details you can see on the School's website), carry out these duties via a combination of in person meetings in School and online meetings via Microsoft Teams, throughout the School year. Ellwood's Board has 2 committees, to which responsibilities are delegated; Performance and Standards and Resources. Individual governors also visit the School during the school day to witness and evidence pupil learning and activities via regular reports to the Board.

One visit took place on February 6, when 2 governors visited School at lunchtime to see how the lunch system was working, particularly after we introduced crockery plates and trays for the EYFS and Year 1 pupils. Historically, they have used partitioned plastic trays and the governors wanted to try proper plates to make eating lunch more enjoyable and normal and for the pupils to develop the motor skill of carrying a proper tray with lunch on. The children are also more likely (as we saw) to use both a knife and fork to eat.

The pupils we spoke to mostly liked it, but it does take a little more time to serve and clear away in quite a busy environment. But we feel the benefits outweigh this and after a discussion with Mrs Milford we feel we are able to extend this to Year 2 pupils.

As a note, the pupils were engaging, polite and very keen to convey their opinions – we like that!
