Year 6 Assessment Data

The data sent home before the summer holiday was provisional data. We now have the actual data (although not yet validated by the DFE).

- Percent combined in Reading, Writing and Maths 45%
- Percent high standard in Reading, Writing and Maths 5%
- Reading expected standard—60%
- Reading exceeding standard—30%
- Writing expected standard 70%
- Writing exceeding standard—25 %
- Maths expected standard—70%
- Maths exceeding standard—10%
- SPAG expected 85%
- SPAG exceeding 40%

These results are a significant improvement on previous years and we are really pleased with them.

School Dinners
