We would like to make you aware of The Online Safety Bill – this new set of laws will help to protect children and adults online. It will make social media companies more responsible for their users' safety on their platforms. https://www.gov.uk/guidance/a-guide-to-the-online-safety-bill

The Bill will make social media companies legally responsible for keeping children and young people safe online.

It will protect children by making social media platforms:

- remove illegal content quickly or prevent it from appearing in the first place. This includes removing content promoting self harm
- prevent children from accessing harmful and age-inappropriate content
- enforce age limits and age-checking measures
- ensure the risks and dangers posed to children on the largest social media platforms are more transparent, including by publishing risk assessments
- provide parents and children with clear and accessible ways to report problems online when they do arise

The online safety laws will mean social media companies will have to keep underage children off their platforms. However, parents will need to ensure that children are not making fake accounts with an older date of birth.

For the February 2024 half-term school holiday period, Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) will provide families in receipt of Free School Meals, who sign up to this offer, with 1 week of vouchers to assist with food costs during the school holidays.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (income-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. We are unable to consider college and sixth form students as well as children who receive infant free school meals (available to all children in reception to year 2); they are not eligible for this scheme.

Families who have signed up previously do not need to re-register for February 2024 holiday vouchers - they will already have been included. Families that have previously signed up will need to contact us with any changes to their circumstances. To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal vouchers for the February 2024 half-term are open from midday 16 January until midday 30 January. Advice for Parents & Carers

SET PARENTAL CONTROLS

Robiax comes with several parental control options, which are explained well on the game's official website. It's essential to enter the correct date of birth for your child, as that allows Robiax to automatically apply the appropriate chat filters. The game also allows parents and cares to set monthly spending restrictions and monitor their child's account.

MONITOR SPENDING

If they don't understand they're using real money, it's easy for children to accidentally spend a sizeable amount in the game. Using parental contrais to piace limits on their spending will help avoid any nasty financial surprises. Ensuring that you have two-factor authentication on your payment accounts also makes it harder for your child to spend money inadvertently.

DISABLE PRIVATE MESSAGING

Roblex's private messaging function raises the risk of children being contacted by people they may not want to speak with – potentially leading to bullying, harassment, toxicity and scam attempts. The game allows you to disable messages from anyone who hasn't been added as a friend on your child's account.

If your child has genuine friends who they plat online with, paying for a private or VIP servers the risk of contact from strangers.
