
Ellwood Nursery will be closed from Friday 15th December. Therefore, there will be no breakfast or after school provision for week commencing 18th December.

# Reading

Congratulations to this week's book winners who each excitedly chose their book prizes during our Celebration Assembly yesterday. The winners were: Niall Edey, Harriet Gane, Esme Wilkins and Ryan Winman. I was delighted with the number of children who had earned a raffle ticket by reading four times (or more) over the twelve days since the start of half term. All ticket winners have received a house point and a class sticker. Each Thursday, we will hold a new raffle and the children understand that they can earn a ticket by reading four times between the Thursday evening and the following Thursday morning (before school). One ticket will be chosen from each class and the winner will choose a book prize to take home. We are aware that many families have an expectation of daily reading – and we fully support this. Please continue to encourage your child with their regular reading.

Please remember that a successful reading session might be just five minutes long. In addition, the children have been made aware that they may choose to read *any* text that interests them e.g. a story strip from their favourite comic or a leaflet about a place they have visited. If, however, they choose to read their school reading book, they should feel greater confidence when tackling the text, as the words will be at the correct level to enable them to read with fluency. Please ensure that after *each* reading session, your child's efforts are recorded, dated and *signed by an adult* in their Reading Record.

I will be running Reading Club for ten minutes during Friday lunchtimes (after the children have enjoyed their meals and had some fresh air). We will begin by listening to a short story (or non-fiction text) and we will then have approximately five minutes for independent reading of our own texts. I will be available to support readers during their independent time and I will aim to invite some children to read aloud with me. Any child who has not had the opportunity to read at home on four (five-minute) occasions throughout the week (Thursday-Thursday) should attend Reading Club. It will also be open to all children (from all classes) who would like to hear our story and enjoy some quiet reading time. Reading Club will begin next week, on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> November. Our first story will be a fable called 'Mercury and the Woodcutter'. I will aim to read a range of fiction and non-fiction texts during the weeks ahead.

Many thanks for your support in encouraging regular reading. It helps tremendously with all aspects of the children's development in English.
