Bream Gardening Society Summer Show 2022

Ever tried growing your own carrots?

Are you aged 15 years or under? Why not have a go and enter the children's competitions for growing the longest carrot!

You can grow the carrot on your own at home or maybe at your school

Things you need to get started

Carrot seeds (Bream Gardening Society can give you seeds, or you can use your own)

A deep container, a length of drainpipe, a thick cardboard tube or a barrel

Sandy compost or soil

What to do

Get your soil or compost ready. Sandy is best, if possible, use a sieve to remove any lumps.

Fill your container or pipe with compost mix and water it.

Sow the seeds in early April. Put 3 or 4 seeds in each pipe/tube or more in a larger container.

Lightly cover with soil and water in.

Cover your container with a layer of fleece or newspaper in case there is frost.

The seeds will take 2 or 3 weeks to germinate.

When the seedlings are about 8cm tall, thin out so there is only one growing per drainpipe, or equivalent. Keep covered in fleece to protect from Carrot Root Fly.

Your carrots might like to feed on some organic fertiliser from time to time.

Ideal growing temperature is 16-21°C.

For the first few weeks, water from the top.

Once your carrot is growing well, start watering from the base to encourage the root to grow downwards.

Bream Gardening Society Summer Show 2022

competition for age 15 and under

Ever tried growing runner beans? Are you aged 15 or under? Why not try now and enter your longest runner bean in the children's competition in August.

Runner Beans can be grown in large containers or in the soil.



You'll need some long canes or sticks to support the plants.

Start the seeds off in a small pot indoors from early May, or straight into the soil from early June. Plant 5cm deep (22cm apart if they're in the soil).



Put sticks into the container or garden soil then, when the plants are large enough, plant them out.

You will need to keep picking beans once they are large enough to eat but remember to keep one to grow as long as possible; then enter it for the show!
