Significant strengths

- The pupil premium child passed the phonic screening check
- KS 1 Pupil Premium children had a higher average point score than those nationally
- KS 2 Pupil Premium children in all subjects was broadly average or above national.
- 5/6 pupil premium pupils at the end of KS 2 made or exceeded progress in Reading, writing and maths and was similar to pupils nationally.
- At the end of KS 2 pupil premium pupils average point score was equal or above national average.
