Attendance

Thank you to those of you that ensure your children attend school regularly. We have had a big increase in the amount of holiday request forms coming into school lately and although by requesting a form you are following the correct procedure, we wanted to remind our parents that children should only be taken out of school for exceptional circumstances. Absences requested for family holidays will not be authorised and if the duration is for 5 days or more, the request will also be sent to the Local Authority and will likely result in a penalty notice. The penalty charge for taking a child out of school is £60 per child, per parent.

If a child has more than 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence across a 10 week period, they may also receive a penalty notice.

We are proud that generally, our whole school attendance is good. We do monitor attendance to identify

any patterns, repeat absences and those that are classed as persistently absent. Parents that have children which are classed as being persistently absent can be referred to Early Help and will be contacted by Mrs Charles.

Unfortunately taking holidays in term time not only affects your own child with missed learning, but also affects the rest of the class, as teachers and TAs then have to spend time trying to ensure your child can catch up on missed lessons and key elements of learning that they need in order to progress through school.

Please feel free to contact us if you are struggling with your child's attendance and feel that talking to our family support worker (Mrs Charles) could help.

The world is run by those who turn up

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year.

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year or 2 full years missed over the course of their school career.

Attending 3¹/₂ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school

Being late for school reduces learning time.

- If your child is 5 minutes late every day they will miss three days of learning each year.
- If your child is 15 minutes late every day they will miss is 2 weeks of learning each year.

Make every minute count

<u>How can t help?</u>

You can help in many ways:

- Encourage good attendance by making sure your child comes to school regularly (see attendance policy on the school's website).
- Take an interest in your child's school work.
- Make sure your child understands that you do not approve of absence from school.
- Support our school in our efforts to control inappropriate behaviour.
- Inform us on the first day of your child's absence, and keep us updated throughout the absence period.
- Cooperate with our school to make sure your child overcomes any attendance problems.
- Discuss planned absences with the Headteacher and apply for permission well in advance.
- Only take your child out of school during term time where the absence has been authorised.

Year 1 - Phonics screening

Children in Year 1, throughout the country, will all be taking part in a phonics screening check during the same week in June. Children in Year 2 will also take the check if they did not achieve the required result when in Year 1 or they have not taken the test before.

The phonics screening check is designed to confirm whether individual children have learnt phonic decoding and blending skills to an appropriate standard.

This year the test will take place week commencing 10th June.

Congratulations to Miss Hayward for completing the London Marathon last weekend! What an amazing achievement and a great example to the children of hard work, resilience and determination.




Beech class - D&T


Beech class have loved exploring microbits!
