We have heard from the Immunisation team this week that some parents have received a text or letter stating that their child should make an appointment for their nasal flu vaccination. They have asked us to share the below letter with you to clarify what has happened.

Dear Parents/Carers

Over the past few days a number of parent/carers whose child has been vaccinated with the Nasal Flu Vaccine at either a school based session or within a community clinic setting have received a text inviting them to arrange an appointment for their child to have their nasal flu vaccine.

Understandably parents/carers are concerned as they know that their child has already received their vaccination. Each child will have been given a flu certificate to take home which shows their child's name and date of vaccination as proof that the vaccination had occurred.

We can confirm that the record of any child who has received their vaccination at school or at a community clinic will have been uploaded by our team onto our Immunisation Database and shared with the National Immunisation Vaccination System.

We would like to apologise to all parents/carers who may have received this text in error. We have raised these concerns and issues with NHS South West Public Health Commissioning Team who are investigating this issue. Please accept our sincere apologies for any inconvenience caused.

Did you know that children develop more rapidly during the first 5 years of their lives than at any other time? S S If you nurture certain skills during the first 5 years, you create a solid foundation from which your child can build on for the rest of their life. Think of it as giving them a head start to learning. S S S S Talking, about starting right, literacy is one of those skills that parents can nurture in those early Q V years. Why literacy? Because reading and writing are the fundamentals of early education, not to mention that they crop up multiple times every single day. From reading road signs and writing Q NA shopping lists to learning a new language, literacy is a skill that is vital for everyone. S S Reading fosters a love of learning which leads to higher grades Q Ja Talking about that lifelong love of learning, that is why reading is important at such an early age. When children learn to read at an early age, they have greater general knowledge, a wider range of vocabulary, they are more fluent readers, and they have improved attention spans and better concentration. As well as stronger oral and literacy skills, proficiency in reading also allows young S S children to understand more, to learn more, and to become competent researchers. As you can imagine, all of these are skills that help young children perform higher in school. Reading ignites creativity, sparks curiosity, and stimulates the imagination in young children. Often, 2 S S this leads to role-play as children grow which helps to develop other skills such as empathy, problem solving, and morality. The biggest psychological benefit is how reading helps to grow Q V self-confidence and independence from such an early age. The simple act of taking time to sit down with your child helps promote greater maturity and discipline. These are essential when it comes to your child learning to read in school.




